### **Instructions to Contractor Requesting Consolidation**

#### **Step 1: Complete the Notice of Consolidation**

A Contractor wishing to consolidate two or more adjudications must complete a Notice of Consolidation.

### Step 2: Provide the Notice of Consolidation to the Parties and the Adjudicators

Pursuant to s. 18.(1) of Ontario Regulation 306/18, the Contractor "shall give to the parties to each of the adjudications to be consolidated and to the adjudicator, if any, of each such adjudication, a written notice of consolidation."

Pursuant to section 18.(3) of *Ontario Regulation 306/18*, the written Notice of Consolidation "may not be given later than the fifth day after the adjudicator in the adjudication receives the documents required by section 13.11 of the Construction Act."

#### Step 3: Provide a copy of the Notice of Adjudication to ODACC

Pursuant to section 18.(2) of *Ontario Regulation 306/18*, "the contractor shall, as soon as possible after giving the last of the notices of consolidation under subsection (1), provide a copy of the notice in electronic format to the Authority."

Within two business days after ODACC receives a Notice of Consolidation, ODACC will create a new consolidated case in ODACC's Custom System and invite all the Parties to the consolidated case.
